Cyber Zone - term-time only!

10.30am - 2.30pm on alternate Saturdays at The Zone beginning on 14th September. There are games consoles (PS3, Wii's, Xbox360), handheld games (PSP's, DSI's, 3DS's, laptops and android tablets. We also have an area for arts & crafts, Duplo and wooden train track for those who aren't keen on gaming. Please remember your food donation towards group lunch - anything your child likes to eat is usually a good idea. The cost is £2 for the first child and £1 for each additional sibling.



After School Zone - term time only!

Every Wednesday during term-time, join us at After School Zone! from 3 - 6pm.

These are drop-in sessions for families to come along to when they want. The suggested donation is £1 per child. The Cyber Zone equipment is there, arts & crafts and more.



Building Zone - term-time only!

Every Thursday during term-time you can join us at Building Zone from 3 - 6pm. You are welcome to drop-in at any time during the session. There's Duplo and Lego and we also have some of the Cyber Zone equipment too. The suggested donation is £1 per child. If models are incredibly precious, you're welcome to keep them for a donation in the tin!



Teen Zone - term time only!

These sessions are especially for those aged 11 years + who want to come along and play console games and socialise with those who are a similar age. On one Friday each month (so far 4th Oct, 1st Nov & 6th Dec) 6 - 8pm; we will have all the Cyber Zone equipment, as well as the pool table, air hockey table, Hexbugs and a tuck shop too! You may bring 12+ rated games but they must be approved by a committee member FIRST. The cost will be £1 per child & money for the tuck shop. Parents need to stay at these sessions.



Teen Zone Out!

To get our teens socialising more, we are planning a variety of Teen Zone Out events. The current plans include attending a wrestling event at Princes Hall, Aldershot on Wednesday 30th October, places cost £12 per child/teen/extra adults + a free carer for those with a diagnosis. Laser-Run: On Friday 2nd November we have 2 sessions at Laser-Run; 11am for those who prefer the lights on & the smoke machine off and then 12pm for those who want to try playing with the lights off & the smoke machine on! The cost is £6 per person.

Branch rules

The aim of the National Autistic Society Hart & Rushmoor Branch is to support people with autism and their families. As parents and carers of people with autism, we volunteer our time to ensure that this support reaches the local areas of Hart, Rushmoor and a small part of Surrey. To help ensure that everyone gets the most from our branch activities, we would appreciate it if you would read and comply with the following:

What you can expect from your branch volunteers -

- They will adopt the National Autistic Society's core values, policies and procedures and fairly represent the branch.
- They will do all they can to create a safe and welcoming environment for all those attending branch events.
- They will treat all other volunteers and branch members with respect. Any physical, emotional, verbal abuse or rudeness towards other volunteers or branch members will not be tolerated.
- They will maintain confidentiality regarding the NAS, its employees, volunteers, branch members and its work.
- They will be reliable. They will make it clear when and how they will be available and meet these expectations, or provide as much notice as possible if they cannot.
- They will respond to queries within agreed time limits. This includes acknowledging all event bookings.
- They will listen to all branch member concerns and respond appropriately.

In return, we ask that all branch members -

- Treat all volunteers and branch members with respect. Any physical, emotional, verbal abuse or rudeness towards volunteers or other branch members will not be tolerated.
- Treat all branch property (including the venues we use) with respect and do not deliberately damage anything.
- Communicate with the branch volunteers. We ask that you tell us if you have any concerns and respond to our questions or queries within the agreed time limits. This includes ensuring that you pre-book for all events* and tell us how and when you will cover the cost (if there is one).
- Supervise and be responsible for their children at all times. As a result, they must do all they can to ensure that their children also follow this code of conduct.
- Pay in advance for branch events when booking places (for drop-in activities it is fine to pay on the day.) We can accept any of the following:
Cheques; made payable to "NAS Hart & Rushmoor" and posted with a booking form to NAS H&R, 118 Fernhill Road, Farnborough, GU14 9DR.
Cash; at any of our Zone activities or through the door at the address above.
Paypal; whether you have a Paypal account or not, you can use your credit or debit card.
 Simply go to www.paypal.co.uk and make payment to paypal@nasHandR.org
- Seek committee permission before taking photos at our branch events - and if you prefer not to have your photograph taken and used in our newsletter etc. Please let us know.

* When responding to advertised events on Facebook, do not just click "attending" as this does not guarantee you a place. Please send a message with the details required. All bookings will get a response confirming receipt and places.

If a branch member fails to comply with the above they may be asked to leave the branch and will no longer be able to attend activities. 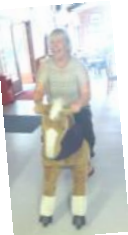
Fun Zone!

These are for Hampshire recreation and leisure activity providers and parents/carers. Price per workshop: Hampshire parents/carers, £7 per person; Hampshire activity providers (all others), £15 per person standard price; £10 per person for voluntary organisations or for those that work on a voluntary basis. Daytime workshop, 10am - 2pm: *The Passionate Mind, how people with autism learn*

Dr. Wendy Lawson MAPS; BPS, an adult with high functioning autism, presents internationally and is well published. Having written numerous papers and books, (varying from her autobiography to an everyday text on Autism) Wendy explores the influence of individual neurological development with reference to impact upon learning styles.

Wendy's workshops are research based and focus upon building bridges between the neurologically typical (NT) and autism spectrum (AS) worlds. Relationships; formal, informal, familiar or otherwise, all need to be negotiated. Typically, developing individuals seem to have little difficulty with communicating needs, wants and desires.

Being AS however, means we understand the world differently. This implies a clash in the social arena. Social demand and interaction for AS individuals is a nightmare.

Evening workshop: *Understanding challenging behaviour of children with Autism Spectrum*

This workshop will run from 6.30 - 10pm and explore ways to encourage communication for individuals with autism spectrum conditions (ASC); suggest supportive interventions and environments that may help in ASC; show how the above can lead to success in ASC and enable individuals with ASC to feel good about who they are.

Shaving ideas!

This topic came up on the Facebook group recently; teens and the woes of shaving, be it boys and their faces or girls and their legs!

The general consensus was that electric shavers are safer but they can cause problems to those with sensory issues who cannot cope with the buzzing sound and vibration/tickling and although a razor avoids the sensory issues, they are far harder to control and not injure themselves with!

Then there was the suggestion of using hair removal cream but again this can cause sensory issues with the feeling of the cream and the smell of it

but it doesn't involve any blades, noise or vibration!
